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WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR DATA

The data controller for the organisation of this event is **Mittetulundusühing The Clash Baltic**, registry code 80644958, Akadeemia tn 5-13, 80011 Pärnu, Estonia, e-mail info@theclash.ee.

Registration runs on **Smoothcomp** (Smoothcomp AB, Sweden). Smoothcomp is an independent data controller for your Smoothcomp account under its own privacy policy (smoothcomp.com/en/privacypolicy). When you register for our event, we receive your registration data and this notice governs what we do with it.

Medical documents stay on paper. Your medical certificate and blood-test results are inspected by the event medical team at the venue, are not photographed, copied or stored, and are handed back to you. Only the outcome (cleared / not cleared) is recorded. Medical details are seen by medical staff only, who work under professional confidentiality. The non-pregnancy confirmation (female athletes 14 and older) happens confidentially at the medical check and is not collected through registration.

WHO RECEIVES DATA

- **Smoothcomp** — registration platform (independent controller, see above).
- **National and international federations** (ESVL/IMMAF, WAKO, EMTF/IFMA) — results and, where their rules require, medical suspensions.
- **Anti-doping organisations** — if you are tested: the testing authority, the applicable federation, and WADA's ADAMS system (hosted in Canada). Transfers rest on the applicable anti-doping rules.
- **Event medical service** — medical checks, under confidentiality.
- **Public authorities** — where the law requires (for example child-protection notifications).
- We do not sell data and do not share it with marketers.

TRANSFERS OUTSIDE THE EU

Doping-control data may reach ADAMS (Canada) and, in a dispute, CAS (Switzerland — EU adequacy). Smoothcomp's own transfers (including to the United States under SCC/DPF) are governed by Smoothcomp's privacy policy.

HOW LONG WE KEEP DATA

Signed declarations	10 years after the event (30 years for injury-incident files), then deleted, including from Smoothcomp
Accreditation and coach records	1 year after the event
Cleared/not-cleared checklists	10 years after the event, aligned with declarations (30 years for injury-incident files)
Competition results	Indefinitely (sporting record)
Published media	Per its editorial life; you can object to future use of identifying footage
Background-check verification	Verification log kept 1 year with coach records (document type, issuing authority, issue date, reference number, verifier, date, outcome); the extract itself is deleted after verification

YOUR RIGHTS

Access, correction, deletion, restriction, objection, and portability where applicable; withdrawal of consent for consent-based processing (featured content) at any time with effect for the future. CHILDREN

Athletes from age 10 participate. A parent or guardian signs the declaration and this notice's summary is available in plain language for young athletes (child-readable summary to be published alongside). Medical testing and documentation of minors happens only with parental consent. Featured filming of a minor happens only with parental opt-in.
